ORDER OF DISMISSAL

THIS CASE came on this 10th day of October, 2000, on the order to show cause issued by the court on September 6, 2000 and entered on the docket on September 7, 2000. The debtor filed the petition in this case on July 31, 2000. On August 17, 2000, he filed a petition under chapter 13 of the United States Bankruptcy Code. The schedules and statement of financial affairs in this case reflected that the debtor was unemployed. However, the schedules and statement of financial affairs in the case filed on August 17, 2000, reflect that the debtor was employed. Counsel states that although the debtor filed the chapter 13 petition on August 17, 2000, he actually obtained employment on August 29, 2000.

The chapter 13 case was assigned to the Honorable Stephen S. Mitchell who issued a rule to show cause why that case ought not be dismissed. Upon hearing on the order to show cause, the case was dismissed.

In light of the debtor's conduct in both cases and in light of his employment which makes a chapter 13 plan feasible, this case will be dismissed. The debtor does not object to dismissal of this case. It is, therefore,

ORDERED that this case be and is hereby dismissed without prejudice.
